### Description

EPF 2<sup>nd</sup> online event took place in four sessions held between October 10<sup>th</sup> and May 20<sup>th</sup>. Aim of the event was to show the progress of the project, with a short glimpse of the previous EPF workshops held in Italy, France, Spain, and Germany, and to introduce the next ones presenting the issues that are going to be addressed: **Navigating Change: Women's Education, Employment, and Climate Challenges** was the title of the event, conducted by Gemina Silva. A special session of the event was held on November 6 at the Comunità La Tempesta in Gorizia, gathering the hosts of the therapeutic community to talk about gender equality.

**Sol Ailén Oddone**, Project Manager at *Guaraní Association* (Spain) was our first guest talking about *Social and labour intervention with long-term unemployed women*. The Guaraní Association is a non-profit, non-denominational, apolitical social organization committed to working with vulnerable groups at risk of exclusion, such as the foreign population, with all their social and personal characteristics, including ethnicity, beliefs, sexual orientation, disability, or other personal or social condition, addressing issues related to immigration and integration, groups at risk of social exclusion and gender equality and opportunities. Sol presented us the experiences of the Association, running projects to provide training to persons in vulnerable positions, such as migrant women. Key factors for the successful labor integration are personal empowerment, personalized counseling, and the development of transversal and digital skills.

Second speaker was **Martina Leighob**, from A Sud (Italy), talking about Women's access to education. A Sud describes itself as "an independent, radical, horizontal, feminist environmental organization... (we) investigate the causes of environmental crises, denounce those responsible, defend human rights, build tools for local communities, educate and inform." Starting from the lack of knowledge among the youth of the objectives of the Agenda 2030, A Sud is running a project to educate young people on the topics of environment, sustainability and circular economy. Martina told us about the poor participation of women in the STEAM studies, and so the association she represented started the Sustainability Hub, a platform and activities to teach young women and men in 5 Italian regions.

**Marta Nuero Aristizabal**, coordinator of Iroko. Desarrollo Forestal Sostenible (Spain) was the last guest, talking about Climate change from a gender perspective. Iroko- DFS is aimed to the reduction of the climate change, helping with the management of natural resources, formulating, executing and realizing the continuation of development projects for communities in tropical countries. Experts in medium-environmental technical advice for institutions or associations that work in development, Iroko DFS bring its specific knowledge to multidisciplinary projects, focusing on education and cooperation for development, volunteering projects and environmental education. Marta described the impact of climate changes in the southern part of the world, one of the biggest causes for migration, and how this impacts the daily life of the women, the greatest caregivers to families.

326 people participated to the event, coming from 16 different countries, testifying the interest of the public for the initiative and its themes, with a great majority of women.

In each session participants were requested to answer to the Eurojustice questionnaire about the project, the CERV program and the European Union in general.
