Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

EPF 3rd online event took place in seven sessions held between December 4th, 2024, and July 16th, 2025. Aim of the event was to show the progress of the project, with a short glimpse of the previous EPF workshops held in Italy, France, Spain, and Germany, and to introduce the next ones presenting the issues that are going to be addressed: **Gender stereotypes in the arts, harassment and discrimination** was the title of the event, conducted by Prof. Sebastien Quenot from the University of Corsica P. Paoli, with three main speeches.

Jenna El Hilali, Doctor of Comparative Literature at the University, was our first guest talking about the influence of classical myths from the Mediterranean basin on modern gender stereotypes.

Marie Péré and Camille Courrieu, Students from Institut National Supérieur du Professorat et de l'Éducation – Corsica, gave a second speech about the situation on harassment in the Académie de Corse and a project to combat this phenomenon.

Léa Salvini, Director of the Centre d'Information sur les Droits des Femmes et des Familles de Corse du Sud presented the major missions of the institution she heads.

Due to the relevance of the discussed topics, the onsite meetings were held at the P. Paoli University campus in Corte, where students attending courses on literature, pedagogy and other humanistic disciplines followed closely the speakers' contributions.

The other online sessions, that followed the same scheme, were dedicated to a less specific audience, involving attendees from several countries, to spread the news about EPF across Europe, gathering women and activists interested in the subject matters more in general.

In the meeting we all could see how gender stereotypes come from a remote past, from the northern shore of the Mediterranean Sea but also from the south, with surprising similarities. We also learned about an interesting project from Corsica, teaching the youngest students about great women, making examples out of history and so highlighting the values these relevant figures embodied.

The event was articulated in seven sessions, both online and onsite, to guarantee the widest participation accommodating different audiences with different languages (English, Italian and French) and different contexts.

313 people participated to the event, coming from 18 different countries, testifying the interest of the public for the initiative and its themes, with a great majority of women.
